



Hand Washing and Hand Sanitizer

Parents/Guardians

If soap and water are unavailable, alcohol-based hand sanitizer (with at least 60% alcohol) is an effective alternative for cleaning hands and is recommended as an alternative to soap and water by the New York State Department of Health. Student use of alcohol-based hand sanitizers will always be supervised by a school administrator.

All classrooms and therapy areas will have 8 oz spray bottles filled with hand sanitizer. Teachers, therapists, and administrators will spray one pump of hand sanitizer on the student's hand for them to rub together and air dry. There's an adequate amount of hand sanitizer sprayed on the hand but not too much that wouldn't allow for fast air-drying.

Parents/guardians have the option to opt their student(s) out of using hand sanitizer as an alternative.
